2nd Vice Governor's Message


Dear fellow Lions, Leos and partners,

Tales from our Clubs

Ryedale Lions



Some of our Clubs are still reflecting on their **fantastic**, **festive work** and one of those are our Lions in Ryedale.

Over the Christmas period, the Club raised over £12,000 from sponsorships and donations from local businesses and local residents as a part of their Santa Sleigh Campaign. Leading from the front was the Club's Sleigh organiser, Ben Hayes, who was responsible for putting together a seamless programme and schedule.

Added to that, the Club also **supported those with very little** this Christmas by providing 28 hampers which were put together by **The Old Weigh** based in Pickering. The names and addresses of the recipients of these hampers were provided by Pickering Town Council, Kirkbymoorside Foodbank and the Pickering Foodshare. **A superb effort; Lions making a difference.**

In Knaresborough, the Lions also had such a **busy Christmas**.

From late November, their Santa's sleighs were out in the everexpanding town. Supporting Santa was a **valiant team of volunteers as well as Piccadilly Motors** who provided a car to tow the sleigh and a place for storage and to give the batteries a charge for the sound system and lights.

Holme Valley Lions



In the Holme Valley, a **new social media routine** has been tested for the local Club's Santa Sleighs.

To save time on their runs, the Lions put their **Sleigh routes on social media with the locations and times** where they would be stopping. This helped maximise how long they spent in well-attended areas and lessen their time in other places. Overall, the new approach seems to have been **well received** and ensured that the Club could get around a number of local supermarkets/farm shops and villages in the area.

All of this helped make the sleigh runs a huge success, especially with some sponsorship and saw £3880 being raised (around £5000 after Gift Aid) which will be reinvested into local causes.

Darlington Lions Club has donated £2,000 to Age UK (North Yorkshire and Darlington) to fund an additional day's Information and Advice service for 16 weeks, helping to support older people in the region during the challenging winter months.

Age UK's regional branches are independent charities which do not get any funding from the national charity to run their free Information and Advice Services where they help people, their carers and their families.

Teesdale and District Lions

Thorne Rural Lions

Thorne Rural Lions have started the New Year very strong with a **hefty donation to a great cause**.

Using funds raised from their recent Golf Day the Lions were able to contribute £2000 to the Yorkshire Air Ambulance who provide an emergency service to around 5 million people covering 3 million acres of land.

Additionally, the Club has been helping those in need over



Christmas through the purchase of **Warm Weather Packs** which have included thermos mugs, blankets and scarves. 20 such packs have been provided to vulnerable people. Furthermore, their **7th Annual Toy Appeal** was also a great success with many **hundreds of pounds worth of new toys** donated from the Thorne Rural community which were distributed to local children over December.

Tickhill and District Lions



Another Club which has been helping the needy is Tickhill and District Lions who have **handed out 100 hampers** to individuals in their community.

Over December, a total of £5,000 was spent on food items to ensure that all recipients had a healthy, nutritious hamper, along with some goodies. These incredible packs included staples such as potatoes, rice, pasta and bread as well as treats such as mice pies and hot chocolates.

Working with local churches, youth groups, Food Hubs and Food Trains to identify those who were to receive the hampers, the Lions have made a **huge difference** to their community this winter.

Rothwell District Lions

Back in October, the POTN was pleased to include a piece from Rothwell District Lions. Within this report, the Club explained how they had **used Facebook to** advertise collection points for old or foreign coins/notes. Now, a few months on, this project has proven to be an amazing one.

Since starting in September, the Club is proud to announce that many of these coins have proven to be a real, money spinner. Those which have been sold on Ebay have made £221 whilst separate, bulk sales have made £428. The biggest single sale was £20 for an 1847 Queen Victoria Silver Crown.



Meanwhile, the oldest coin which has been obtained is a **Roman Denarius which shows Faustina** (the wife of Marcus Aurelius) and was **minted somewhere between 147 -175 (AD).** Currently, this remains unsold but I do know a **certain Editor who might want this one.**..

The **City of Culture** status is awarded to a local community every four years. It will do this through opening them up to new experiences and support them to develop a number of key skills such as woodcraft, cooking, nature identification and shelter building

Helping them are Boroughbridge Lions who have **previously backed another Forest School** in the area. Their contribution has been **massively appreciated by Boroughbridge High School** as it has provided an opportunity which would otherwise be unavailable to its young people.

Another club which has been helping some excellent young people are Elmet Lions A short while back, the Lions donated some of their money to the Sherburn Community Gymnastics Club and decided to 'jump' at the opportunity to see how it had been spent.

As a result, President Maggie and Vice President John went to a gymnastic practice session where they were shown an unbelievably brilliant routine which they will be taking to Euro Disney in Paris in the Autumn of 2025.

The stoves, which are built and delivered by **Lions together with the Lions Foundation**, are necessary as the infrastructure has been destroyed in many areas. Subsequently, the Ukraine Prime Minister has urged all citizens to look for **alternative sources of heat and light**. Due to the work of our Lions worldwide, we have collectively been able to provided £2.7 million pounds to provide generators and stoves in the last two years and this assistance will continue until the infrastructure issues are resolved.
