Filey Lions

There were categories for 0-9 year olds and those who are 10+ with prizes ranging from £10 to £30. Winning the top prizes were **Lila (age 4) and Daisy (age 10)**.

A couple of days later, the Club was even busier with their very popular **bonfire and fireworks display**. This huge, free event was attended by a staggering **3500 people** and included a **range of stalls such as coffee and teas and a coconut shy**. **Excellent work Lions!**



Dumfries Lions

The Dumfries Lions Club have been putting their hands in their pocket to help **seven local organisations**. This has seen **£2325** given away in a hearty display of community spirit.

The recipients included the **Food Train, the River of Life Church and the Queen of the South Community Trust**. The financial contributions were between **£300 to £500**.



Expanding their connection to their community more, the Club have also recently partnered with the **Queen of the South FC Trust and the Loreburne Shopping Centre in Dumfries** to arrange joint venture promotional and fundraising events. Members also enjoyed their **42nd Charter Anniversary** recently which was attended by District Governor Gillian Swan and representatives from Lions Clubs in **Dalbeattie, Dundee, Thirsk and Garforth**.

Boroughbridge Lions



The **Boroughbridge Community Larder**, which was brought into existence via joint sponsorship from its local Lions and **Boroughbridge Community Charity (BCC)**, is celebrating an incredible **2 and a half years of helping people**.

The Larder's Project Co-ordinator is **Lion Sue Johnson** and it is run by **40 volunteers including 11 Lions**. Its aim is to reduce food waste and stop edible food from going to landfill.

Whilst it is not a food bank, it does prove to be a vital lifeline for many of the **8424 visitors** who have gone through the door. rather incredibly, it has already taken **42.3 tons of food out of landfill**. It achieves this by receiving surplus food from local supermarkets, shops, the allotment society or local householders. Any leftover food is given to Primary and Secondary Schools for their Breakfast Club. **A brilliant, environmentally friendly project - inspirational!**

Castleford & Pontefract District Lions

Sometimes, disappointment can happen. In Castleford and Pontefract for example, the Lions were disappointed to discover that their **Lantern Festival and Parade** could not go ahead for the first time in 10 years. However, the Club came up with an exciting alternative – a **Lantern Festival Competition**.

The contest was arranged with a number of **free workshops to make the Christmas Lanterns**. Entries were categorized into 3 age groups: up to 10 years, 11 – 17 Years and 18 Years and over. The winner of each category would receive a **£50.00 voucher**.



With the support of our **local Civic Society**, the lanterns were placed in the Pontefract Market Hall and will be subject to a **public vote for the best lantern** in each category. As this is the first time, there were some nerves as to how the competition would be received. Despite this, over **30 entries were received** and we look forward to hearing the results very soon!



Wetherby District Lions



There have been some **very active paws** in Wetherby, where Lions have taken part in several acts of service.

With the rest of the nation on November 10th, Wetherby District Lions remembered the personnel who gave their lives in various conflicts by **laying a wreath at the cenotaph**.

After this, on the 15th November, alongside Morrisons supermarket they hosted their **4th Annual Quiz** for all their business supporters. **28 different businesses** combined to help with this great event as they fought for the **prestigious trophy and raffle prizes**. Members of the **Yorkshire Air Ambulance** also attended this year's quiz to receive a donation of **£1000**.

Finally, two day's later, the Club started a new exciting project with the **Wetherby Explorers Scouting Group to plant 110 saplings** along a local disused railway line. **Well done all!**

Colne Valley Lions



In Colne Valley, a lot of positive work has been going on.

Two new members have been inducted, helping the Club grow in strength. President Mick Parry had the honour of inducting **Lion Cameron Gallagher and Christine Codling** into the fold.

Once again, the Club had a great response to the **Peace Poster competition with over 100 entries**. After a very difficult, choice, the

Club chose 12 year old **Rueben Cooper's design to go through to the District Final**. He will receive a £50 Gift voucher as well as a certificate. They also had four primary schools taking part in the **Roar Competition** with some amazing inventions and brilliant presentations.

Finally, the Club took part in a successful push for Children in Need at their local Tesco and held their final, big fundraising event of the year with a **Christmas Fayre at the local Floral Hall**. Lions and Shop volunteers were run off their feet with the **hoards of people** who come through the doors - it was all worthwhile though with **£2216 being raised!**



Elmet Lions



It's been a big month for Elmet Lions who ran their **Annual Inter Pub Quiz** at the end of October.

9 pubs put themselves forward for the huge event in the Sherburn in Elmet area where they all had **100 general knowledge questions to answer within 30 minutes**.

As part of the quiz, they were encouraged to organise a team and appoint a spokesperson – who gave the answer to the Reader of the questions.

The team which received the most correct answers in the shortest time is declared the winner. The participants are also competing to donate as much as they can as well. This year, **The Blacksmiths Biggin** got a double whammy raising **£142.90 and giving 76 correct in 27 mins/15 seconds**.

After this, stalwart Elmet Lions and one volunteer (*pictured*) braved the cold to **shake rattle and roll collecting buckets at Selby Firework display**. They collected a brilliant **£642** in and some of this will go back to support Selby due to the absence of a Lion Club there.

Rothwell District Lions

Running is a great sport, it keeps you fit and can get you places rather quickly. Across the country, Park Runs have become a popular pastime and a community, bonding experience.

For a number of years, **Rothwell Springhead Park**, on a Saturday morning, has seen runners from the local area turn out to undertake a **5km Park Run**. The event is well organised with marshals along the course to look after the safety of the runners concerned



The run which is free to all, has always seen a good turnout but the **organisers recently approached Rothwell District Lions** to ask for financial assistance in setting up a Sunday event for **younger members of up to 14 years of age**.

Having considered the application, the Lions were pleased to be able to agree to the request and have now presented the **organisers with a cheque for £500** which will go towards the setting up costs. The Lions hope that this will **establish links between themselves and the park runners** which could lead to cooperation between the two parties for the benefit of the whole community.
