



Elmet Lions attended the Co-op post-community grant bash where every organisation that had benefitted from the Community Grant was represented. The **Sherburn Co-Op had raised over £2000 for the Club's PSA testing** which was run in September 2024 and will run again in September 2025. They were happy to say a big '**thank you**' to them for allowing them to test over 400 men.

Added to this, Elmet Lions also donated the range of **Wild Tribe Hero** books to a local nursery. **Kim's Kiddicare Kabin** were delighted to

receive the books – especially as they **are about the environment** which the Principal felt was very appropriate for the immediately pre-school children.

Ryedale Lions



As part of their ongoing support for the **Lake Victoria Children**, Ryedale Lions Club has provided a donation of **£250 to support the Sickle Cell Project** for the children on Ukerewe Island, Tanzania in Eastern Africa.

This donation follows **previous contributions of £250** to Ukerewe Island to provide the children with school uniforms. The children are not permitted to attend school unless they have a uniform. **For just £5, a school uniform can be provided**. Some of the donation has also been used to provide solar lighting to

allow the children to complete their homework. The **solar lighting is replacing the original kerosene lamps** which are not particularly environmentally friendly.

The Club are proud to keep supporting this great initiative and recently received a letter of thanks from Alex Magaga who is the Chairman of the organisation.
